Examples of pink-footed grubbing in different vegetation classes

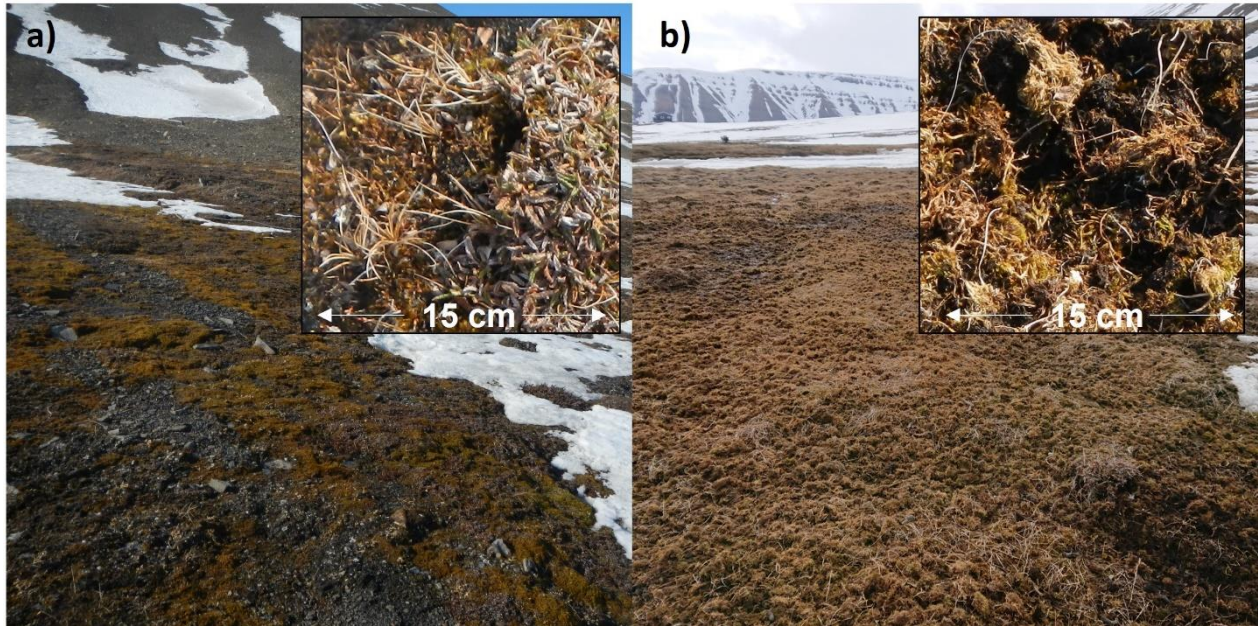


Figure S1: (a) Dwarf-shrub heath tundra and (b) moss tundra vegetation class in late May 2019.
