1 Based on the exit questions we identified seventeen participants who were suspicious about the bogus nature of the implicit emotion task. None of the results changed when we ran our analyses without these participants.

2 An analysis of corrugator supercilii activity during the picture viewing task revealed the expected interaction between *picture type* and *time*, $F(6, 504) = 4.64$, $p = .002$, $\eta_p^2 = .05$, $\varepsilon = .61$. Corrugator activity increased over time during fearful pictures and remained stable during neutral pictures. We found no effects of *concept*, indicating that corrugator activity while viewing pictures was not influenced by concept activation.
