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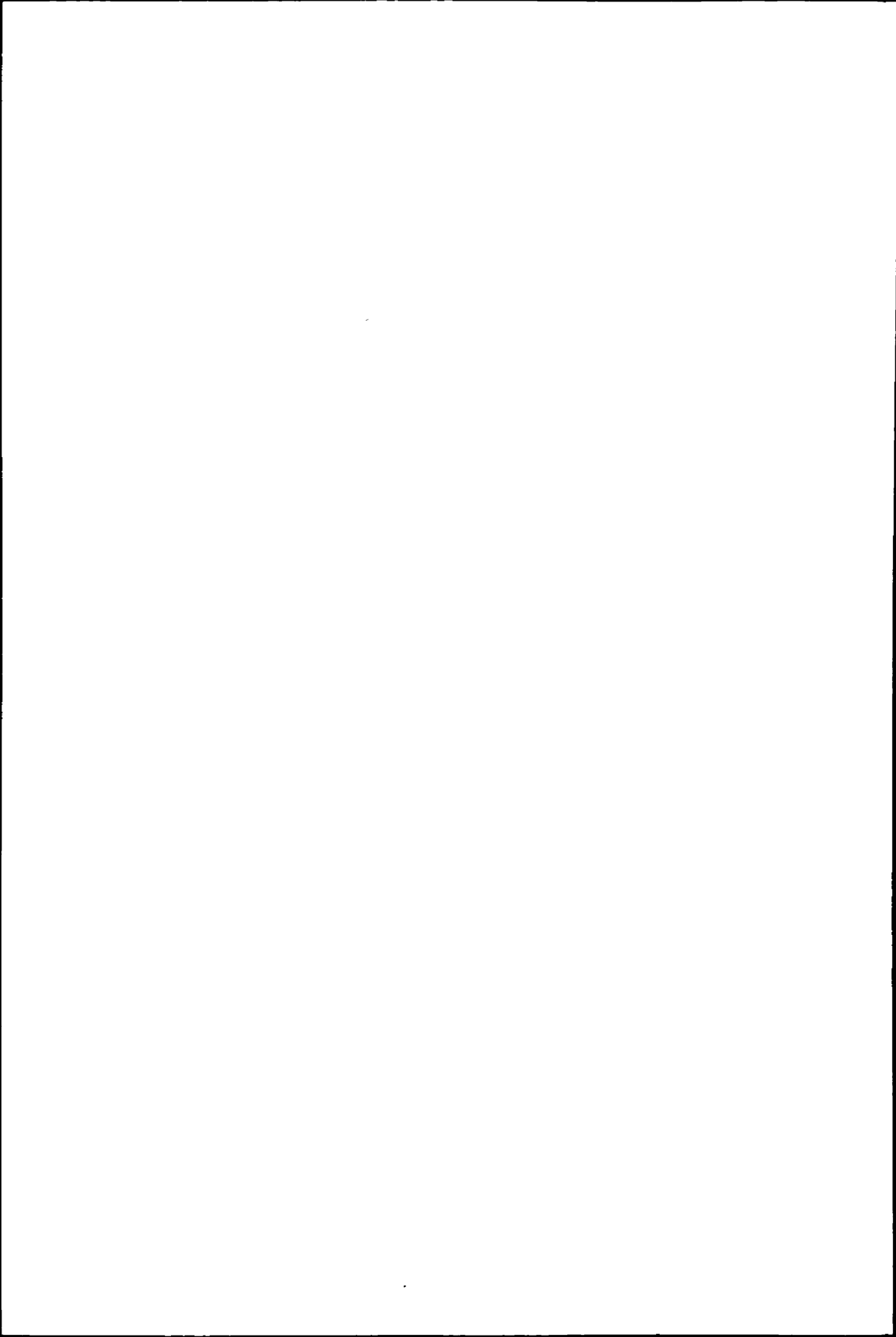

Albert Wiegman was born on June 28th, 1956 in Amsterdam.

From 1984 – 1985 he was a resident in Internal Medicine at the Medical Center of Alkmaar and from 1985 –1986 he worked as a resident in the department of Neonatology of the Academic Medical Center. From 1986 on he was trained as a pediatrician under the supervision of Prof.dr. C.J. de Groot and was registered in March 1991.
