Curriculum Vitae

Sanne Lise Anne de Vries was born on the 29th of January 1984 in Utrecht, the Netherlands. In 2002 she graduated from high school (Johan de Witt Gymnasium, Utrecht) and in the same year she started a Bachelor Education and Behavioral Development at the Utrecht University. In 2007 she obtained a Master of Science degree in Pedagogical Sciences (MSc) and in 2008 a Master of Arts degree in Criminology (MA) at Utrecht University. As a Master's student (MSc) Sanne participated in the interdisciplinary – law and social sciences – research group conducting international comparative research in youth courts.
