

### Correction to Lindgren et al. (2016)

In the article “Implicit Alcohol Associations, Especially Drinking Identity, Predict Drinking Over Time,” by Kristen P. Lindgren, Clayton Neighbors, Bethany A. Teachman, Scott A. Baldwin, Jeanette Norris, Debra Kaysen, Melissa L. Gasser, and Reinout W. Wiers (*Health Psychology*, 2016, Vol. 35, No. 8, pp. 908–918, <http://dx.doi.org/10.1037/hea0000396>), two responses for item 9 of the Alcohol Use Disorders Identification Test (AUDIT; Babor et al., 2001) were coded incorrectly. Specifically, the response options “Yes, but not in the last year” and “Yes, during the last year” were coded 1 and 2, respectively, instead of 2 and 4, respectively. This error occurred across all time points. Correcting this error resulted in slight changes to some of the coefficients reported in the models with the AUDIT as the dependent variable. Changes occurred in the hundredth decimal place, and in no case did the corrected scoring make a substantive change to the results (i.e., no effects that were significant become nonsignificant and no effects that were nonsignificant become significant).

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
