³²⁵ There are two lists available with information on the location of some Cretan Archaic pithoi: Brisart (2007) includes a detailed catalogue of (mostly) the pithoi from Aphrati, as well as of other Cretan pithos fragments from Lyktos, Aghios Georgios Papoura, Smari, Gonies, Astritsi, Aghia Anna, Knossos and a few of unknown provenance. His list is arranged according to style, fabric, decoration and workshops, therefore serving more as a guide to identify the most tractable characteristics of Cretan relief pithoi. To some extent, his catalogue is indicative of the wide dispersal of these fragments to various museums in Europe and beyond; however this dispersal is more apparent in Linda Anderson's PhD dissertation on Greek Late Geometric-Archaic pithoi, part of which is devoted to Crete (Anderson 1975). Appendix II of the present thesis draws from these two publications but it includes some new, hitherto unknown entries of Archaic Cretan pithoi, and it is organized according to their geographical dispersion rather than their provenance. As such, it mostly aims at updating Anderson's version of 1975, and thus placing emphasis in the wide dissemination of pithoi. As shown in Appendix II, many entries either have no reference/acquisition number or I have not been able to trace them. Wherever available, the numbers are provided accordingly.
